Balsam Fir - Native to NY & Canada. Needles are 3/4 to 1-1/2" long, dark and shiny green. It prefers well-drained soil and north and east slopes. Balsam Fir is widely used as Christmas trees.

Fraser Fir- This evergreen is known to be an excellent Christmas tree, partly because the needles aren't nearly as sharp as a spruce. This tree prefers well drained soil.

Colorado Blue Spruce - Steel blue foliage. Fast growing. Prefers heavier soils with full sun. This evergreen conifer is widely used in windbreaks when spaced 6 feet apart or as an ornamental yard tree.

White Cedar - Trees have a broad pyramidal shape with erect branches that are dense and crowded together. This evergreen tree prefers a deep, well drained site. American Arborvitae or White Cedar is one of the most popular of all trees for windbreaks and year round privacy screening.

Native Birch - 50' high, single or multi-stemmed slender tree. Native birch has white bark that will appear after 3 to 4 years. This tree will grow well in moist soils.

Sugar Maple – 50' with a spreading canopy tree at maturity. Prefers well-drained soils. Brilliant fall leaf colors and pleasing growth habit.

Red Oak - 60-70' symmetrical tree. The Red Oak is a great timber tree. Prefers sandy soils.

Black Cherry - Black Cherry will have profuse white flowers in the spring, and brilliant gold leaf color in the fall. Fruit from this tree is good for making wine and jelly, and is also a great food for wildlife.

Highbush Blueberry – Duke/Bluecrop blueberry grow well in cooler climates. Known both for their early season fruit, which is large with a firm, crisp texture, and high yield of berries. Mature at 5-6 feet with a 5-6' spread.

Red Raspberry "Latham" - Adapts well to a range of soil types and cold hardy. Fruit is outstanding for fresh-eating, freezing, and canning. Fruit ripens in mid-July. Self-pollinating.

Pink Lady Apple – Pink lady apple trees are a cross between Lady Williams and Golden Delicious, giving the fruit good storage characteristics and a sweet, crisp flavor. They are apples are prized for both fresh eating and cooking.

Honeycrisp Apple –The tree is one of the most vigorous and hardy of apple trees, showing little damage at -40 degrees. Honeycrisp fruit is characterized by an exceptionally crisp and juicy texture.

Summit Sweet Cherry – Summit is vigorous and spreading variety, tolerant of low winter temperatures, that bear very large fruit.

Montmorency Tart Cherry – America's most popular tart cherry for pies and preserves. The Montmorency cherry tree is a cold-hardy variety that ripens early in the season. The medium sized red fruit has a firm yellow flesh; clear juice; and a rich, tart flavor, great for bakers and jam makers.
